I therefore feel obliged to remind parents and carers to consider the very real dangers posed by the large influx of strangers to our area, the darker undertones of the gig culture and the potential peer pressure for young people to indulge to excess in adult or illegal activities. All students will have a special assembly on this event this week and will be informed by the Police, whose numbers have been bolstered for this festival, about the formal action that will be taken for all drug, alcohol or public order related offences.
5. The Student Council have made an excellent start to the term. Tre had the best turn out followed by Pol and Kev. The **Make your Mark** votes were sorted by the Student Council and LCA value 'Work

experience hubs for 11- 18 year olds' as the most important agenda. This is fantastic news, as we have a lot in store this academic year for work experience, so please tell students to look out for career and work experience opportunities.
