Last week we received the very sad news that Miss Goodwin, Leader of Learning for Performing Arts and Teacher of Dance is seriously ill and is unlikely to return to school this Academic Year. We all send her our very best wishes and hope that she is able to return to school occasionally to see students' performances in the future. Miss Wood will take on the temporary role of Leader of Learning for Performing Arts and Mrs Jackman will oversee the KS4 BTEC exam classes until we have recruited a temporary dance teacher.
2. We are looking forward to the 'Toad of Toad Hall' whole school production in February and are seeking additional support from staff for the Arts team. Please attend the meeting at lunchtime Monday 13.25 if you can help. (Mrs Jackman's office)
3. On Thursday afternoon Miss Oldham and her Year 9 class will go to see a performance at the Millpool Centre in Looe. This is part of 'Storysmiths', a programme designed to celebrate the joy of reading and the importance of keeping local libraries open. 'The Scary Little Girls' are a small professional theatre company, touring Cornwall with engaging readings from literary classics, mixed with a little poetry and music.
4. We look forward to welcoming representatives from the Rotary Club of Liskeard and Looe on Wednesday and Thursday this week when they will provide 'mock interviews' for students in Year 11. These interviews give students practice to prepare them for real life interviews at colleges and places of work in the future.
5. On Tuesday we will launch a new software system called MyConcern. This is a safe and secure software for recording and managing all safeguarding concerns in school. All staff will be required to attend the training for this on Tuesday this week at 3.30pm. This session will be held during the first 30 minutes of the teaching staff meeting, therefore, non-teaching staff are required to attend until 4pm.

6. I am delighted that Rebecca Jeavons our new Head Girl will be representing the Academy at the next Looe Town Council meeting on Monday.
7. We welcome back 'Brook' and 'Diversity Role Models' to work with Year 8 students on Thursday. Brook provides relationship and sex education to 250,000 young people UK-wide, they work closely with young people to help them make positive and healthy lifestyle choices and to improve their personal health and emotional wellbeing. Diversity Role Models actively seek to prevent homophobic and transphobic bullying in UK schools by educating young people about difference, challenging stereotypes and addressing the misuse of language.
8. Thank you to Claire Calverley from the Play it Again Theatre Company for joining us for assembly last week to inform students about a performance project that the company are offering. 'Kilminorth: Assemble!' will be held at the Millpool Centre in Looe on Saturday, 2-5pm, from 28 January until 20 May. This is a free of charge performance project for 12 to 18 year olds which will build skills in acting, storytelling, script-writing, stage combat, Cornish wrestling, sign language and sculpture. These skills will then be used in an outdoor performance for local families in mid-May. Leaflets are available in reception with further details.
