<p>Health, Safety and Wellbeing The Academy is open to students on school days from 0800 – students should not arrive before this time as there is inadequate supervision. 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1. Thank you to Mrs Feldberg for arranging the trip to the Theatre Royal in Plymouth last week to see War Horse and to the other staff who supported. I was pleased to hear how much this was enjoyed by all.
2. On Thursday we look forward to welcoming students from feeder primaries who will take place in workshops to learn about online safety and wellbeing.
3. This Friday we are going to support Jeans for Genes Day by holding a 'jeans' mufti day. Students will be allowed to wear their jeans to school for a suggested donation to the charity of £1. Normal academy uniform should be worn apart from jeans and shoes and there will be a special assembly on Friday to raise awareness. Jeans for Genes raise funds to support children affected by genetic disorders. There are around 6,000 genetic disorders. It is estimated that one in 25 children is affected by a genetic disorder, 30,000 babies and children are newly diagnosed in the UK each year.
4. Next week we look forward to the residential trip for Year 7 students to Porthpean Outdoor Education Centre which will be from Monday to Wednesday. The focus of the residential will be for tutors to spend time with their tutor groups and for students to get to know their tutors and experience out-of-school learning with their new peers. We hope this experience will build long lasting bonds that will help the settling in period in the first term. There will be an information evening for parents and carers on Wednesday at 6pm.

5. During the weekend of 21 to 23 September, Looe plays host to the Looe Saves the Day Festival. In the past the Looe Music Festival weekend has created issues for some young people who, despite all the warnings and against everything they are taught about personal safety, ignore all the danger signs as they choose (or are pressured or enticed in to) a weekend of revelry beyond their years and often well above their emotional and physiological capacity. We therefore feel obliged to remind parents and carers to consider the very real dangers posed by the large influx of strangers to our area, the darker undertones of the gig culture and the potential peer pressure for young people to indulge to excess in adult or illegal activities. I will hold an assembly this week to share the importance of this message.
6. Please note that the section of Barbican Road outside of the Academy is being resurfaced this week. The road will be closed (access for emergency vehicles only) on Monday and Tuesday between 9.30am and 12.00 and between 1pm and 2.30pm. From Wednesday this section will be under traffic light control.
7. Thank you to the staff who have used the IRIS Connect system. IRIS will be in the PE and MFL department this week. This device and software will be used for videoing lessons for the purpose of staff development and school improvement.
